#### OC Year 5 entry in 2025:

Applications are open from 4 April to 20 May 2024

<u>What are opportunity classes?</u> Opportunity classes are one of the ways the NSW Department of Education supports high potential and gifted students.

The classes help students learn by:

- grouping them with other gifted students
- using specialised teaching methods so students can learn concepts quicker and in more detail.
- supporting their wellbeing needs. Most students in opportunity classes enjoy learning with peers who have similar abilities and interests. Opportunity classes are not zoned.



## A Message from the Deputy Principals

**Where are they located?** There are 86 primary schools with Year 5 opportunity classes in NSW each year.

- 54 schools are located in metropolitan Sydney
- 31 schools are located in rural or regional centres

• a virtual class, Aurora College, for rural and remote students is available in over 600 authorised host schools.

Students successfully placed attend the opportunity class full time in Years 5 and 6 at the relevant public school. In most cases, students who have accepted a place in an opportunity class will leave their current school to attend the school with the opportunity class.

**Should you apply?** If your child learns with greater ease and speed than their classmates, they may benefit from enrolment in an Opportunity Class. High potential and gifted children need to be challenged so they remain engaged with their education.

#### Equity provisions

The Equity Placement Model helps to make access to opportunity classes fairer for the following under-represented groups:

- students from low socio-educational advantage backgrounds
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students
- students from rural and remote locations
- students with disability.

The Equity Placement Model holds up to 20% of places at each school for students from these groups to support an increase in their participation. Students from these groups may be considered for equity placement if their test performance is within 10% of general applicants for each school.

## **Attendance Guidelines**

#### Late Arrival to School:

Students are required to be at school and prepared for learning by 9.00am. If a student arrives late for any reason, they must first obtain a late note from the office before joining their class.

#### Leaving School Early:

To sign out your child early, parents should visit the office to receive an early slip. It is advisable to arrange pick-up times outside of break periods. Parents are not allowed to enter the school grounds during breaks and are requested to collect their child at an appropriate time.

#### **Extended Absence:**

While traveling during school holidays is encouraged, if travel during the term is essential and your child will be absent for over 10 school days, please complete an <u>Application for</u> <u>Extended Leave Form</u> prior to the travel dates.

A copy of your travel itinerary and the completed form must be submitted to the administration office for Principal review.

#### Planned Absence:

For absences spanning from a full day to up to 10 days, please use School Bytes through the attendance tab for submission.

#### **Absence SMS:**

If your child is absent or late to school, you will receive an sms. This sms will link you to School Bytes where you can action any Unexplained Absences by selecting respond. Any absence not explained after 7 days will be recorded as an unjustified absence.

## **Moving Schools**

For families that will be leaving Girraween Public School, a Student Exit form must be completed prior to your departure.

A confirmation of enrolment from the child's new school will be required to complete exit formalities.

## **School Bytes**

This year we have transitioned to School Bytes for our school administration system and parent portal.

School Bytes provides a parent portal to help your school communicate with you.

Our school may use the parent portal for various things, including online permission notes, attendance, and payments, which can be accessed via a secure link. The School Bytes parent portal enables you to view all your children in one portal and process payments for multiple siblings in one transaction.

IMPORTANT: To ensure that the registration process works smoothly and you can link your account to your child(ren), make sure that you use the same email address that you have provided to the school or if using a different email address, an SMS verification code will be sent to the mobile phone number on record for you at the school.



In the very fast paced world we live in, we understand the need for you, our parents/carers to have the flexibility to make payments outside of school hours and furthermore, the ability to receive and respond to communication at a time that best suits your needs.

#### Changes you can expect

- The students Statement of Account and payment reminders will be sent directly to parents/caregivers via email.
- Emails will be sent to you from noreply@mail.schoolbytes.education.
- The student's Statement of Account email will include the make a payment button that will take you to the school's online payment portal.
- If an activity involves a cost, the make a payment button will allow you to pay securely, quickly and easily via credit or debit card after granting permission (Visa and Mastercard only).
- Online forms including permission notes, will be sent to you directly via School Bytes with a link enclosed. Select the link to open the secure online form.
- The online form will have information about the activity with a section for a digital signature (either with a mouse or your finger) prior to submitting.

Students had the opportunity to support their sports team by wearing a jersey and catching a few balls on the Sydney Thunder inflatable!




