Science and Digital Technology	Science Living World: This term students continue learning about the living world, with more focus on the classification, life cycles and survival of living things. Students consider the agricultural processes used to grow plants and raise animals.	Digital Technology This term focuses on digital systems and how they transmit data. Students explore different types of data, have the opportunity to learn how to interpret patterns and develop skills in visual programming. This further develops students' knowledge and understanding of computational thinking and abstraction.
History (Semester 1)	Celebrations and Commemorations This topic provides a study of identity and diversity in both a local and broader context. Moving from the heritage of their local area, students explore the historical features and diversity of their community. They examine local, state and national symbols and emblems of significance, and celebrations and commemorations, both locally and in other places around the world.	
PDH/PE	PDH Students will have learning opportunities to explore the importance of resilience in achieving success and set goals for developing skills and strengths that will help them persevere in their day-to-day life.
