



► Enrolment Policy

Community Language is not an elective language program. It is a maintenance program for home languages.

Students are placed in CL classes based on the information provided by parents at enrolment about the main home language.

Linguistically similar languages have been placed together.


OC Classes 2021 (Year 4 moving to Year 5)

To apply for OC Placement, parents will need to register and apply through the high performing students application website. This is an external process to Girraween Public School and families have full responsibility for applying.








Mindfulness




